The Organising Committee of the *VIII International Congress DDHH GLOBAL 2027: Human Rights and Globalisation* is pleased to invite scholars, researchers, doctoral candidates, legal professionals, public-policy makers, representatives of public institutions, civil-society organisations and other interested participants from around the world to take part in the Congress and contribute to its academic programme.

The eighth edition of the Congress, entitled *Human Rights, Technology and Global Vulnerabilities in the Age of Artificial Intelligence*, will take place at the Faculty of Law of the Complutense University of Madrid, Spain, from 17 to 19 March 2027. The in-person programme will be preceded by an online session, available via live streaming, on 16 March 2027.

DDHH GLOBAL 2027 is jointly coordinated by the Faculty of Law of the Complutense University of Madrid and the *Ibero-American Portal for Knowledge Transfer (INTRACOM)*, in collaboration with the University of Sevilla, University of La Laguna – *Cátedra Javier Muguerza* -, University of Córdoba, and *The Lisbon Public Law Research Centre* of the University of Lisbon, Portugal.

PRESENTATION

The 8th Edition of **DDHH GLOBAL 2027** will bring together researchers, legal professionals, activists, public policy makers and civil society representatives to engage in interdisciplinary dialogue that bridges theoretical reflection and transformative action, local analysis and global perspective on *Human Rights and Globalization*. The Congress invites critical, comparative and constructive contributions from legal, philosophical, political, social, technological, cultural and interdisciplinary perspectives.

DDHH GLOBAL 2027 will provide an international forum for examining how AI, digital platforms, data-intensive systems and emerging technological infrastructures are reshaping the conditions for the effective enjoyment, interpretation, protection and institutional guarantee of Human rights. This 8th Edition will pay particular attention to the ways in which these developments affect persons and groups in situations of structural, social, economic, political, epistemic or technological vulnerability.

Thematic lines

Proposals may address the central theme of the Congress through any relevant approach. The following **thematic lines** are indicative and non-exhaustive.

Potential sub-topics within the overall theme of the Congress may include:

- AI, Regulation and Fundamental Rights
- Digital Citizenship and Algorithmic Governance
- Armed Conflict, International Humanitarian Law and Transitional Justice
- Indigenous Peoples, Territoriality and Environmental Justice
- Interculturality and Legal Pluralism
- Religious Freedom, Hate Speech and Plural Coexistence
- Vulnerability, Social Exclusion and Citizenship
- Migration, Borders, Asylum and Technological Control
- Gender, Sexual Diversity and Digital Violence
- Human Rights in Contemporary Culture: Cinema, Communication and Arts

We also welcome proposals that connect the main Congress' theme to other emerging

questions in Human rights, Law, Social Justice and Global vulnerabilities.

Structure of the Congress: Forms of Participation

The **DDHH GLOBAL 2027** program will include Keynote speeches, Plenary sessions, Parallel sessions & Thematic Panels, individual Papers, Symposia, Workshops, Roundtables, Posters and book presentations.

Distinguished Keynote speakers will be invited to address the overarching theme of the Congress. Selected contributions may be scheduled in plenary or parallel sessions, either in person (**17-19 March**) or online (**16 March**), according to the format of the activity and the final configuration of the program*.

*Academic Committees reserve the right to determine the final selection of proposals and participants, as well as the format, duration, composition, scheduling and placement of all accepted activities within the Congress program. When necessary, the Committees may recommend that a proposal be incorporated into a different session format or thematic line from that initially requested.

Languages

The working languages of the Congress are Spanish, English and Portuguese.

- Proposals intended for plenary sessions must be presented in either Spanish or English.
- Proposals for individual papers, thematic panels, symposia, workshops, seminars, roundtables, posters and book presentations may be submitted and presented in Spanish, English or Portuguese.

The final allocation of languages and sessions will depend on the availability of appropriate academic and technical arrangements and will remain at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

Simultaneous online subtitles between Spanish and English will be provided for plenary sessions, subject to technical availability.

Participants presenting in Spanish, English or Portuguese outside plenary sessions should therefore ensure that their contribution is accessible to the expected audience, for example by using visual materials, handouts or slides in one of the other working languages where appropriate.

Proposals for Individual papers and Other forms of participation

Scholars, researchers, doctoral candidates, practitioners and representatives of public institutions and civil-society organizations from around the world are invited to submit proposals related to the Congress theme and its thematic lines.

The Congress welcomes proposals in the following formats:

- **Individual papers:** Original research presentations addressing a specific question, argument, case study, theoretical framework, legal development, methodological issue or set of findings. Accepted papers will be assigned to plenary or parallel thematic sessions at the discretion of the Organizing and Academic Committees.
- **Thematic panels and Symposia:** Coordinated sessions bringing together several individual contributions around a shared research question, thematic area, project, debate or comparative perspective designed to facilitate sustained and critical dialogue on a defined theme, scholarly controversy, recent legal or policy development, or emerging field of research inquiry. Panel and Symposia proposals should demonstrate intellectual coherence and include a Coordinator or Chair, as well as a

provisional list of speakers and presentation titles.

- **Workshops:** Participatory sessions focused on research methods, research-project results, institutional practices, training, policy-oriented discussion, collaborative learning or the exchange of professional experience.
- **Seminars and roundtables:** Focused sessions intended to promote in-depth exchange among specialists, researchers, practitioners and participants. They may take the form of an expert dialogue, moderated roundtable, debate or discussion centered on a shared problem, current development or research agenda.
- **Book presentations:** Sessions devoted to recently published or forthcoming scholarly books of direct relevance to the Congress theme. Proposals may include the author or editor, one or more commentators and a moderator, where appropriate.
- **Poster presentations:** Visual presentations of original research, work in progress, doctoral research, research projects, case studies, empirical findings, methodological approaches or policy initiatives relevant to the Congress thematic lines. Poster sessions will provide an opportunity for direct discussion between authors and participants and are particularly suitable for doctoral candidates, early-career researchers and teams wishing to present the activities or results of a research group, project or network*.

*Authors of accepted posters will be responsible for preparing and bringing their poster to the Congress venue. Posters should be prepared in A1 portrait format and must be self-contained, clearly legible and accessible to a non-specialist interdisciplinary audience. Detailed technical instructions, including mounting arrangements and the time allocated for poster discussion, will be communicated to authors of accepted proposals.

**The Organizing and Academic Committees reserve the right to determine the final selection of proposals and participants, as well as the appropriate format, duration, composition, language, scheduling and placement of accepted activities within the Congress program.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Proposals must be submitted in accordance with the procedure set out on the official **DDHH GLOBAL 2027** website.

Prior registration through the Congress registration platform is required before submitting a proposal:

Each submission must contain the following information:

- Title: Maximum 150 characters.
- Language: The language of each proposal should be clearly indicated at the time of submission.
- Abstract: 300-500 words: objectives, theoretical framework and methodology, results or arguments, conclusions and relevance.
- Keywords: 4 to 6 terms.
- Thematic line: Indicate the main line (1-10).
- Format: Paper, panel, poster, workshop or round table.
- Authorship: Full name, institutional affiliation, country and email address.

The general deadline for proposals remains 15 February 2027.

Proposals for Thematic Panels, Parallel Sessions & Symposia

Proposals for Thematic Panels, Symposia and Parallel Sessions are especially welcome. Such collaborations may be coordinated by members of the International Scientific and Academic Committees of **DDHH GLOBAL 2027**.

Proposals may also be submitted by Research groups, funded Research projects, Doctoral programmes, Universities and other academic institutions and Research networks, or civil-society organizations working in fields relevant to the Congress theme.

The submission of a coordinated proposal does not replace the registration requirements applicable to individual participants once an activity has been accepted.

- Undergraduate and postgraduate students, as well as teaching and research staff of the Complutense University of Madrid, will also be eligible for a reduced registration fee, subject to the conditions set out on the official Congress website.
